Important Notices

- Registration will take place at the lobby of the Student Activity Center (SAC) starting at 7:30 AM on Thursday, Sep. 23. If you can, please arrive early at the registration desk to avoid the crowd. The Workshop shuttle van will run from Holiday Inn Express to SAC starting 7:15 AM on Thursday about every 15 minutes. In order to save cost and minimize waste, we decide not to provide you with customary conference bags. Instead we will provide nice folders. Please bring your own bags or briefcases.

1. Workshop Venue

All plenary sessions and working group sessions will be held in the Student Activity Center (SAC) at the Stony Brook west campus. The Workshop reception on Thursday evening will be held at the University Club, 2nd floor, Chemistry Building on the west campus. The Workshop banquet on Friday will be held at the Old Field Country Club at West Meadow Beach in Setauket.

Directions to SAC from the Long Island Express way (I-495)

Exit from East bound Long Island Expressway (I-495) at exit 62 (Nicolls Road). Follow the loop to Stony Brook direction which will go under the freeway. Go on Nicolls Road (Route 97) north for about 10 minutes. After passing the intersection at Route 347, you will pass the South Entrance to the Stony Brook West Campus on the left. Then you will pass the University Hospital towers on your right and at the next traffic light you will see the Main Entrance on the left. Take a left at the Main Entrance. Pass the first stop sign and make a quick left on to Campus Drive. After passing the Sports Complex (white building) on the right and tall Physics and Math tower buildings on the left, you will find two large Faculty/Staff parking lots on your left. Park your car in the second (the larger) parking lot. SAC is two-minute walk from the parking lot opposite from the parking lot entrance. There will be signs posted to guide you way.

II. Scientific Program

The program for the plenary sessions has been finalized and is posted on the web. The detailed schedule of the Working group sessions will be announced at the Workshop.

III. Proceedings

Copies of transparencies from all talks will be scanned and be accessible via the Workshop website at the conclusion of the Workshop. Written proceedings of the Workshop will be published. Detailed instructions will be given to the speakers.

IV. Registration

To register please complete the registration form available on the web as accurately as possible to speed up the processing. The registration fee for the Workshop is \$200. This includes coffee breaks, welcome reception, banquet, conference proceedings and local transportation. (Please note that this does not include the Sunday theater trip explained below.) Extra tickets for the banquet are available if you wish to bring guests.

Payment of registration fees may be made in cash, check, or money order at the registration desk. The check or money order must be a bank draft, certified check, or money order in US dollars. Personal checks must be drawn on a US bank. Make checks or money order payable to SBF 266430.

Regretfully, checks drawn in foreign currency will be returned. Please include your check or money order when sending your registration form to the address below. Please include the name of the registrant on the check.

Registration will take place at the lobby of the Student Activity Center (SAC) starting at 7:30 AM on Thursday, Sep. 23. If you can, please arrive early at the registration desk to avoid the crowd.

V. Transportation

Stony Brook is reached most conveniently by rental car and limousine services. Please refer to the detailed information on the Workshop webpage for reservations. It is also advised that you reserve your return limousine service to airports as early as you can.

Local Transportation

There will be shuttle bus service between the Holiday Inn Express and the Campus in the mornings and evenings during the Workshop. Transportation to and from the Workshop banquet on Friday evening will be provided. Also transportation to and from Port Jefferson Village will be provided on Thursday evening after the Workshop reception and on Saturday after the workshop for your convenience. Thursday, September 23: Shuttle buses will run between Holiday Inn Express and SAC auditorium about every 15 minutes between 7:15 AM and 9:00 AM.

A detailed shuttle bus schedule will be provided upon your arrival for the rest of the Workshop period.

VI. Parking

A limited number of parking permits will be available for participants. They will be distributed to the registered participants on a first-come-first-served basis. With a parking permit, one can park in almost all parking lots on campus. Parking is relatively easy before 10 AM and after 5 PM. On the first day of the workshop, park your car in the H parking lot. (Please refer to the directions given above and campus map on the web.) Come to the registration desk and pick up the parking permit. It is only a short one or two minute walk.

Welcoming Reception, Thursday, Sep. 23, 6:30 - 8:30 PM, University Club:

All participants and their companions are welcome at free of charge.

Workshop Banquet, Friday, Sep. 24, 7:00 - 11:00 PM, Old Field Country Club:

A buffet style banquet will be held at the Old Field Country Club at West Meadow Beach. Live music will be provided. Companions are welcome to join the banquet with \$50/person fee. The companion tickets need to be purchased in advance.

Sunday Theater Trip, "Ragtime", Sunday, Sep. 26, 3:00 PM show, Ford Center for the Performing Arts:

A limited number of tickets are group-purchased for the convenience of the workshop participants who wish to see the hit Broadway musical "Ragtime" (winner of 8 Tony Awards) at the Ford Center for the Performing Arts in Manhattan. The show time is 3:00 PM on Sunday, Sep. 26, 1999. **(Only one \$33 ticket is left.)**

We have arranged round trip transportation to the theater for the convenience of the participants. Only limited seats are available for this transportation. Please sign-up for the transportation as soon as you can when you arrive at Stony Brook. We will pick you up at your hotels on Sunday around 11 AM. \$30/person fee will be charged for this service.

VIII. Companion Programs

Companions are welcome to join all Workshop social events: Workshop reception, the Banquet and the theater trip. There will be a fee for the banquet (\$50/person) and the Sunday theater trip. Tickets should be purchased in advance.

Thursday, September 23, 10:00AM - 4PM: Tour of Stony Brook and Port Jefferson Village areas. Visit historic sites important in the revolutionary war and colonial period of the US. Shop at local boutiques and galleries.

Friday, September 24, 8:30AM - 5PM: Tour of artists Jackson Pollock-Lee Krasner house, and Hamptons in Eastern Long Island. Pollock created his Abstract-Expressionist master pieces in this house/studio. You will experience the essence of Pollock's creative working methods and environment. The tour will include a visit to East and South Hampton Villages.

Saturday, September 25, 8:30AM - 5PM: Tour of Gugenheim Museum/Metropolitan Museum/Central Park area in Manhattan. Visit the world famous Metropolitan Museum of Arts and the recently restored and expanded Gugenheim Museum. Or stroll through Central Park. Or shop! (This tour may be substituted by a tour of Long Island Wineries depending on the interests of the participants.) IX. Local Information

The Stony Brook campus is located in the middle of historic Long Island about 60 miles east of Manhattan.
